FORMER QUEEN OF SERBIA IS A NUN IN PARIS

Natalie of Serbia Identified When Slashed Across Face by Cabman — Is Last of Obrenovitchs, Serbian Ruling Family, of Whom So Many Members Met Violent Deaths.

Budapest. — A parisian coachman remonstrated with by a seventy-year-old lay sister of Mercy for beating his horse, slashed her, across the face with his whip, and a police investigation, according to the Paris correspondent of the Budapest newspaper Reggel, has disclosed that the aged Sister was the former Queen Natalie of Serbia.

In 1889, when Milan abdicated in favor of his son, Natalie returned to Serbia, but was forced by the regency council to resume her travels. She became reconciled to her former husband four years later, and their divorce was annulled by the Orthodox Synod.

In 1900, when King Alexander married Draga, his parents, who had opposed the marriage, left Serbia for good. Milan died in Vienna a year later, and Natalie went to Paris, and was believed to have died there long ago.

Through the great Basilica, St. Peter's, Santa Maria Maggiore, St. John Lateran, Santa Croce, one continuous stream of pilgrims pours to make visits to these great churches. But it is not all visiting churches and praying, for this evening is Christmas Eve, to be spent in innocent revelry.

Then there is the Swiss Guard, clothed in the sixteenth century uniform designed by Michael Angelo. These men all Swiss, recruited from certain selected cantons. They are a fine reliable body of men, and exceedingly picturesque in their wonderful uniforms.

Nothing too good. But it is very necessary that the reason of all this great splendour should be well understood. As in the Temple of Old, designed by God Himself, nothing is considered at Rome too good for the service of the Almighty.

In the Basilica. But, enough of demolishing turkeys and mince pies — time passes, and this is the night of the Midnight Mass, to be celebrated by the Pope in St. Peter's. We must bustle and secure our seats.

The Mass commences shortly before midnight, but at half-past ten the great Basilica is crowded with thousands upon thousands of Faithful, assembled from all parts of the world to be present when their Holy Father celebrates the great Feast of Christmas.

Indeed, there are representatives from every part of the globe, among whom, probably pilgrims predominate. Our seats are excellently situated, and we while away the long wait by watching what is around us; to many these sights are new, and not always understood.
